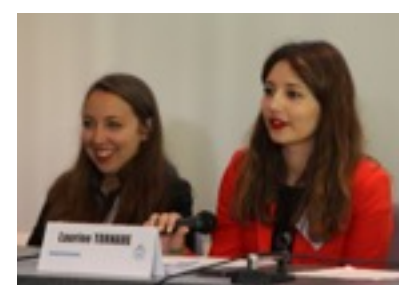

What happened in the committees ?

All the delegations were divided into six committees. They debated all day on several topics. As expected, they gathered around forty clauses. When we went in the committees, we saw that the delegates also made alliances for example, South Korea with Japan, Thailand and India because the clauses proposed by some delegates require co-submitters and signatures. The co-submitters are the delegations which agree on the clause and are ready to defend it. The signatures are delegates who have signed a clause, either to defend it (but not as much as the co-submitters) or to debate on it and explain why they are against it.

To reduce pressure and stress on the delegates, the chairs organized some funny games. For example in the Martin Luther King committee they had a "Just Dance" activity, and in the Aung San Suu Kyi committee they had a "Jelly Belly" challenge and they had to answer embarrassing questions.



How to debate ?

The debates are really strict because there are a lot of rules that the delegates have to follow very seriously.

The delegates take the floor only when the chair invites them to speak. The delegates must talk in the third person because they don't speak with their own opinion, they have to express the opinion of the country they represent.

So they have to begin all the sentences with "Honorable chair and fellow delegates, the delegates of ... (a country) thanks you for your attention and wishes"
